

What is the Bursary application process?

Our application process takes place from June til until 24th October each calendar year.

To summarise:

- ~ Information flyer and application forms available to primary schools in June.
- ~ Applications close on 24th October.
- ~ Applications considered by panel of P&C President (or nominee), Principal and / or Junior Secondary Deputy 25-28th October.
- ~ Bursary recipients parent/guardian notified by phone during first week of November.
- ~ Presentation of bursaries at our Awards Ceremony, normally the second week of November.

Students can apply for more than one bursary category, but only one bursary can be awarded per student.

Each category applied for must have a separate application.

Bursary Panel Selection

The panel assesses each individual bursary application on its own merits as evidenced by the student in their application.

All decisions made by the panel in selecting Bursary recipients are final.

Minimum report card achievements:

Academic Bursary = A Student

Cultural Bursary = C Student

Community Bursary = C Student

Sporting Bursary = C Student

Junior Secondary Transition Bursary

We offer a Junior Secondary Transition Bursary for incoming Year 7 students who feel they have excelled in a bursary category.

The aim of the bursary is to assist with expenses in the transition from primary school to high school. This can be a financially difficult time for families and we would like the opportunity to assist.

We recognise and encourage students who are actively involved in learning and their school community. If you do well with your school work, cultural and community involvement or sporting pursuits we want you to apply for a bursary!

What are the categories?

- ~ Academic
- ~ Cultural
- ~ Sporting
- ~ All Rounder (Academic, cultural and sporting)

One bursary is available in each category.

Who is eligible to apply?

All current year 6 students enrolling at Glenmore SHS for year 7 are eligible to apply to our Junior Secondary Transition Bursary .

How to apply for a Bursary

Students should apply in their own hand writing on the application form with any evidence and submit it at the school office by the closing date.

What does the bursary include?

Bursary recipients receive recognition in the Glenmore High community and are presented with their bursary at our Awards Ceremony.

Each bursary consists of three parts:

- ~ Part 1 includes \$200 towards “Student Resources Scheme (SRS) Fees”. If your SRS is less than \$200 your remaining amount will stay in credit with the school and is not transferrable to another student
- ~ Part 2 is a full “School Uniform” (recipients will receive a shirt, shorts, cap/bucket hat, socks, hoodie, valued at \$160).
- ~ Part 3 is involvement in P&C activities, helping and volunteering your time throughout the year

What to include in your application?

You will be asked to provide personal details, parent/guardian consent, referees (current teacher, coach or community member and current Principal), details of any awards, certificates, and other evidence of excelling in the chosen bursary category.

You will need to write a statement (in 250 words or less), outlining why you believe you should be awarded a bursary.

You will need to provide suitable information and evidence to assist us in considering your application.

Academic examples: a copy of recent school reports; evidence of achievements and participation in events and activities; dedication to school work.

Cultural examples: evidence of involvement and successes in cultural pursuits at school and in the community; current and past involvements and achievements.

Sporting examples: evidence of your sporting achievements at school, club or representative level; sportsmanship qualities.

All Rounder examples: a little bit of academic, cultural and sporting.
