This funding will be used to


- Improve *systemic curriculum delivery* – Version 8 (V8) of Australian Curriculum by 2020 and implementation of new Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) in Year 11, 2019
- Review and reaffirm *effective pedagogy practices*
- Increase the use of *expert teaching teams* to collaborate and develop skill sets across the school

Our initiatives include

- Full implementation of V8 of the Australian Curriculum, including the cross-curricular priorities by expanding our Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Framework (CARF) document to include 7-11 in 2019 and 7-12 in 2020. To achieve this we will utilise both internal and external Educational experts to ensure we are embedding the Australian Curriculum. Implementation will be linked to improvement in A-E data and National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) Scale Scores.
- Implementation of the new Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) and roll-out of new senior syllabi, including professional learning and the development of a robust curriculum, planning, assessment and moderation. With this in mind, the emphasis is to carefully case manage and track our new QCE students in the Senior school, so that 100% of students exit school with QCE, Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA) or Vocational Education and Training (VET) Certificate.
- A Pedagogy Framework inclusive to the teachings of 21st Century Skills, cognitions and literacy strategies, including a review of our current framework, research and high yield pedagogies.
- Embedding High Performing Teams (HPT) Level Systems and Data Walls across faculties so that our teaching teams have strong structures and processes to support student learning.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Using *teacher aides* (across the school including Special Education Program), Community Education Counsellor (CEC) and Local Relief Teacher (LRT) to assist with curriculum implementation – V8 and New QCE
- Incorporating *Spelling Mastery student books* into the junior English classes for improvement across curriculum and data sets
- Providing much needed *Curriculum Resources* across whole school
- Utilising the *Mighty Minds Cognitive Verbs package* to assist all staff and students in the implementation of the new senior syllabi, annually for next 3 years.
- Building a *positive school image in our community* through local news outlets, social media and targeted advertising
- Supporting the implementation of the new QCE with updated *Text Book Resources*
- Assisting in the development of Leadership through *Coaching and Development initiatives* such as HPT
